# **CLOTHESPIN ANGEL**

(10-15 MINUTES)

#### **Materials**

- white spray paint
- ♦ white chenille wire
- white or pastel-colored tulle (available at fabric stores)
- ♦ cotton balls
- ♦ fine-tip permanent felt pen

#### For each child-

 one wooden clothespin (nonspring-type)

### **Standard Supplies**

- ◆ glue
- scissors
- ♦ ruler
- newspaper


**Preparation:** Lay clothespins on newspaper in a well-ventilated area and spray with white spray paint. Allow to dry. Then turn over to paint the opposite side and allow to dry. Cut tulle into 3×6-inch (7.5×15-cm) rectangles—one for each child. Cut chenille wires in half—one half for each child.

## Instruct each child in the following procedures:

- Pinch the tulle together in the center to make wings.
- ◆ Hold together while teacher helps twist chenille wire around the center of tulle (sketch a).
- Place wings against back of clothespin.
- ◆ Wrap chenille wire around the neck of the clothespin twice, leaving ends in front to form arms (sketch b).
- Fold chenille wire ends under to form hands.
- ◆ Pull cotton ball apart to flatten and then glue onto top of clothespin for hair.

◆ Use felt pen to draw face.
