Offer these activities for early arrivers, for kids who finish activities quickly, or whenever there is extra time.

Unit Service Project—Warming Up!

You'll need to provide thin fleece material, scissors, binder clips, and ribbon for this project. Before class, decide how many blankets kids will make and who will receive them. The blankets could be for babies or children at a children's home or a local woman's shelter, or be sent to a missionary to distribute. Cut the fleece to the needed size. You will need two pieces of fleece per blanket, exactly the same size. Tell kids that children all over the world like to go to bed with nice, soft, comforting blankets, but that some children don't have one. Tell students that they'll be making blankets for some of those children. Be sure to tell your students where the blankets will go. Decide whether kids will make the blankets in pairs, small groups, or as a large group. Whatever you decide, be sure that everyone has the opportunity to participate. As kids work, tell them about the organization or ministry that will receive the blankets. Ask questions such as, What might it be like not to have a warm blanket to sleep with? How can you pray for the kids who will receive these blankets? As a group, pray over the completed blankets, asking God to use them to bring joy and warmth to the children who will receive them.

Step 1: You may want to do this step before class. Lay two pieces of fleece on a table with wrong sides together. Use binder clips to hold the two pieces of material together. Cut out a 3"-4" square from each corner. Step 2: Cut slits about 3" deep all the way around, cutting through both layers.

Step 3: Tie the matching top and bottom slits together with double knots. Step 4: When finished, fold the blanket and wrap with a ribbon.

Bible Time Line Fun

Challenge kids to memorize in order the events shown on the Bible time lines. Then have them say the events to each other. For more fun, encourage kids to create one motion for each event, which would help them remember the events.

Prayer Time

Make copies of the *Resources* CD Prayer Request Cards printable file. When a student has a private request she would like you to pray about, she can write it on the "Dear teacher" request card and place it in a box labeled "Prayer Requests for the Teacher." If a student has a request he would like his classmates to pray about, he can write it on the "Dear friends" request card and attach the card to a bulletin board or poster board created to display public prayer requests.
